



**Message From The President**



Feast Anyone?! So many places, so little time!

Note: A January 2014 estimate of web sites and related pages – 861 million sites; 2 billion pages, according to analytics for this topic! These are numbers that I can barely fathom, in the context of the subject. What's your topic de jour or need for information on any given day? The starting point these days should simply be "googling" it; the results are usually mind-boggling. As an option (once you've identified your desired content), if you just wish to simply read as much as possible on a given subject or issue, pick up an e-reader - Kindle or Nook - and gorge yourself on content that was essentially unavailable digitally until recent years. (you can also just download the reading app to your Android, or Apple device!) There is another different and growing dimension of this universe of digital, downloadable content, i.e.- videos and photos – it is also expanding at an amazing pace! (one can 'google' many topics in the Search Box on YouTube for similar results as mentioned above)

Not that long ago VHS tapes, audio books (on tape), CDs and music cassettes were all the rage. Utilizing any or all of these required a degree of special knowhow and the appropriate equipment – just as now; otherwise it was of little value to the curious or potential user. While the aforementioned resources are not exactly irrelevant yet, the explosion of web-based content probably far exceeds these old familiar friends for information, entertainment, etc.

Simply put, as you've probably also discovered, there is a wealth of information to be found on the internet. A significant % of it was largely unknown by us, or inaccessible to us even 5 - 10 yrs. ago. And it's not surprising that new and often never previously available information is appearing almost daily. Remember that # - 2 billion pages! Today it's hard to imagine a body of knowledge in which one cannot locate a large quantity of educational, informative, entertaining or inspirational content.

Please note that when reading this newsletter and you come across a block of blue text that is underlined - this is a "hotlink." Just place your mouse cursor over the hotlink, click the left button and it will take you to a webpage or open your email program to send a message.

## Tech Questions And Answers

**QUESTION:** When viewing a web page, I usually point the mouse cursor to the scroll bar on the right hand side of the page and drag down. Sometimes I just use the mouse wheel when this works. Is there an easier way?

**ANSWER:** Absolutely! Just tap the space bar and it will scroll down a page at a time. To go back, hold down the shift key while you tap the space bar and it will scroll up.

**QUESTION:** When viewing a web page, I often have trouble reading the content because the type is too small. Is there a better way to make the type larger for just this one instance without having to change the overall computer screen resolution?

**ANSWER:** Simply tap the plus (+) key on your keyboard while holding down the Control key and the type will get larger. Keep repeating this process until the type size you want is displayed. To reverse the process, just tap the minus (-) key while holding down the Control key.

**QUESTION:** It takes a considerable amount of time to fill out a website form since I have to remember to click the mouse for each box before I start typing. Is there an easier way?

**ANSWER:** Simply use the tab key to move from box to box. When you get to a pop up menu, just type the first letter of your choice.

**QUESTION:** My computer came with Windows 8, I keep hearing about this Windows 8.1 update, but I can't find it. What am I doing wrong?

**ANSWER:** Unlike earlier versions of Windows, you won't find 8.1 when you choose Windows Update from the control panel. You must click on the Store tile from the metro interface. Until you have downloaded and installed all the critical Windows Update from the control panel, the store tile will not display the 8.1 update.

**QUESTION:** For Anti-Virus protection I'm currently using Microsoft Security Essentials. Is this adequate protection or should I purchase something more robust from one of the companies that specialize in this area?

**ANSWER:** This is one of the most frequently asked questions I encounter. You can find an excellent answer in a newsletter published by the Orange County PC User's Group by clicking <http://www.orcopug.org/pdf/feb2014.pdf>

**QUESTION:** What is "patch Tuesday"?

**ANSWER:** Patch Tuesday occurs on the second Tuesday of each month when Microsoft regularly releases security patches. Starting with Windows 98, Microsoft included a "Windows Update" system that would check for patches to Windows and its components,

which Microsoft would release intermittently. With the release of Microsoft Update, this system also checks for updates to other Microsoft products, such as Office, Visual Studio and SQL Server. There are also updates which are published daily (e.g. definitions for Windows Defender and Microsoft Security Essentials) or irregularly. Microsoft has an apparent pattern of releasing a larger number of updates in even-numbered months, and fewer in odd-numbered months.

**QUESTION:** What is MSRT and what does it do?

**ANSWER:** MSRT is an acronym for Microsoft's Malicious Software Removal Tool. This is a computer program that gets updated monthly and is an anti-malware utility that checks your computer for infections by specific, prevalent malicious software and helps remove malware and any other infections found. Once each month, on patch Tuesday, your computer will be required to restart and during the boot up process MSRT is scanning your computer. If you are curious about MSRT and would like to learn more, click on Start, in the text box type MRT and then hit the enter key. A window will then pop up that explains what this tool does and gives you the option to manually run any of three different types of scans whenever you so choose.

**QUESTION:** I've been told that there's a place where you can go back in time and see what a website looked like at an earlier date. Is this true?


**ANSWER:** If you point your web browser to [www.archive.org](http://www.archive.org), you will see an area called the Wayback Machine where over 400 billion webpages have been stored over time. Going as far back as 1996, you will see a calendar showing the dates on which pages were saved.

**QUESTION:** I have records and cassette tapes that I would like to convert to CD's. How do I do this?

**ANSWER:** There are many alternatives using a combination of hardware and software, but the easiest way is to bring your media over to the PC Workshop, where we have equipment that you can use and supervisors to help you.



# Microsoft Safety and Security Center



With security updates for Windows XP ending in April 2014, many people are concerned that it may no longer be safe to use this 13 year old operating system. Microsoft has established this site at [www.microsoft.com/security](http://www.microsoft.com/security) to address these concerns.

At this site, you will also find a considerable amount of information and tools that address security issues for all versions of the Microsoft Windows Operating System. The site

gives you quick access to the download link for the free Microsoft anti-virus program, a link to download and install the latest Windows Update security patches and a tool to remove some viruses with the free Microsoft Security Scanner.

You will also find a wealth of information that covers security basics, safe use of social sites, password guidance and tips on how to better protect your personal information.

## Tech News Of Interest



 Windows 8.1



It's about time! The tech world has finally agreed upon a new standard for USB that will allow plugs to be rotated 180° and still fit into the new USB receptacles.

If you are using Windows 8.1 and have applied all the latest update patches, Microsoft may have a pleasant surprise for you. In desktop mode, place your mouse cursor over that group of tiles in the lower left hand corner of your screen, click the **right** mouse button and see what happens.

Microsoft has now released Office for iPad. If you have purchased Office365, Office for iPad is free. At \$99/year, Office365 makes sense for people who need a full office suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Publisher, Access, Outlook and One Note) on up to five computers and an unlimited number of iPhones and iPads.

It's been reported recently that some club members have received emails from people they didn't know with links to websites con-




taining malware. As usual, **NEVER** click on a link that came from an unknown source.

Much like the Year 2000 scare, many pundits are overdramatizing the risks and eagerly trying to sell you a new computer, a new operations system or some sort of special software to compensate for the end of security patches. # Earthquake Monitoring




The PC Club installed an earthquake monitoring station three years ago that is an operating node for the Quake Catcher Network (OCN) 24 hours a day every day of the year. QCN is a network that utilizes personal computers operating with Microsoft or Apple operating systems for their control functions. There are approximately 2,000 computers in the QCN network operating around the world. The data acquired by this network is accumulated on the Berkley (BOINC) computer network for analysis by seismic experts as a supplement to the evidence recorded by the United States Geological Seismic System (USGS).

Our system has a sensor permanently attached to the structure of the Administration Building in the computer workshop and it continuously displays and records the instantaneous vibrations occurring in the building. When a signal is received that exceeds a level of 3.0 on the Richter Scale, the system will automatically record the E-W, N-S and Vertical data scans and transmit the information to the QCN center at Berkley.

In addition to the primary function of recording local earthquake data the system receives worldwide earthquake information from the USGS providing the location and intensity of all current earthquakes that are being monitored. This information is displayed in the form of day or night conditions. When in the day time configuration the primary

purpose is to focus on the geographical location of the earthquake. When the night time display is utilized it shows the lights in the area, to focus on the population concentration at the earthquake location. The “Ring of Fire” where earthquakes are most likely to occur is particularly vivid in the night time display.

The epicenter of the recent Earthquake in La Habra on March 28, 2014 was 24.93 miles from Laguna Woods and produced the following traces at our earthquake computer.

**Free Car For Your Road Trip.** If you love road trips but don't own a car, you can get one free to travel the highways and byways of the U.S. if you sign on as a driver for an auto relocation service. Services such as [Auto Driveaway](#) need drivers to transport cars for corporate fleets, RV owners, people who purchase vehicles online and those who migrate south in the winter. You must be 23 years old and have a valid driver's license. You must pay a security deposit of \$350, but it will be refunded. You'll even get a free tank of gas. You'll have a specified number of days to complete your trip.

**Free Software.** For many basic computing needs, you can get free software rather than shelling out for the [Microsoft Office Home & Student suite](#) (\$139.99), [Quicken Starter Edition](#) (\$29.99), [Adobe Photoshop Elements](#) (\$99.99) and other popular programs. For word processing, spreadsheets and multimedia presentations, try [LibreOffice.org](#), [OpenOffice.org](#) or [Google Docs](#). To manage finances, try the free budgeting program at [Mint.com](#) and for photo and video editing, try [Aviary](#), [Picasa](#), [Pixlr](#) or Apple's [iMovie](#) software.

**Free Shipping.** If you love to shop online but hate to pay for shipping, go to [FreeShipping.org](#). The site can direct you to retailers who offer free shipping on every order, big or small. The site also gives you coupon codes to snag free shipping at other retailers. Many

retailers' sites offer free shipping if you'll pick up the order at a local store, including [AceHardware.com](#), [BestBuy.com](#), [Payless.com](#), [REI.com](#) and [Walmart.com](#).

**Free Digital Storage.** With free online backup storage, you can share files and protect them from computer crashes, theft and natural disaster. Windows [OneDrive](#) gives you 7 gigabytes of free, secure digital storage space. You can also use [Amazon Cloud Drive](#) (5 GB free) or [Dropbox](#) (2 GB free).

**Free Price Watcher.** Don't you hate it when you pay for a flight, and then the price drops? Enlist the help of [Yapta.com](#), which tracks your flight's price after you buy your ticket. If the fare drops, it will notify you and help you collect a refund or travel vouchers from the airline. (Note: Yapta only kicks in if the price drop exceeds the ticket-change fee you'd be obligated to pay.) Yapta does the same for hotels too. [Tingo](#) automatically rebooks your room at the lower rate if the hotel drops its price. Then you'll get a refund for the difference. For rental cars, try [AutoSlash.com](#).

**Free Computer Security.** You don't have to pay \$50 or more a year for security software. [Avast Antivirus](#) and [Microsoft Security Essentials for Windows](#) get good reviews from tech experts and offer basic defenses, including malware protection.

**Free Tour Guides.** Prefer to explore at your

own pace? Browse the free audio walking tours available for download at [iTunes.com](http://iTunes.com), [Audisseyguides.com](http://Audisseyguides.com) and [iAudioguide.com](http://iAudioguide.com). You can also search the Web for walking tours of your destination. In our simple search, we found free audio tour downloads from Boston and Chicago to Dublin and Jerusalem. To get a real feel for a city when you're traveling, team up with a local. The [Global Greeter Network](#) organizes volunteers in several cities worldwide to show you around, give you the inside scoop and answer your questions. Tours can last a couple hours, and there's a strict no-tipping policy.

**Free Travel Apps.** Several free mobile applications can help you save time and money when you travel by car. For example, [GasBuddy](#) helps you find the cheapest gas prices near you. [Yelp](#) is great for finding restaurants, shops, attractions and more because it provides reviews, star ratings and directions to help you get to the place you want to go. For more, see [11 Great Apps for Road Trips](#).

**Free Shopping Apps.** Are your key ring and wallet getting crowded? Use the free [Key Ring app](#) to store all of your bar-coded loyalty, membership and library cards on your phone. You simply scan your phone at the point of service. Online shoppers can stay organized with [Slice](#), which tracks packages and notifies you of price drops on items you al-

ready bought so you can recoup the difference from the merchant. To help you get the best price, use apps such as [Red Laser](#) or [ShopSavvy](#), which scan any bar code in the store and instantly compare prices for the same item online. For in-store coupons, try [Coupon Sherpa](#) or [RetailMeNot](#).

**Free Museums and Parks.** Many top-notch museums, galleries and zoos offer free admission year-round, including the [Smithsonian museums](#) in Washington, D.C., the [Getty Center](#) in Los Angeles, and Chicago's [Lincoln Park Zoo](#). Others, including the [Museum of Modern Art in New York](#), let you in for free on certain days of the week or month. Bank of America cardholders can gain free admission to more than 150 museums on the first full weekend of every month. Click [here](#) for details.

Our national parks boast some of the most beautiful scenery in the country, and some don't charge entrance fees, including the Great Smoky Mountains and Blue Ridge Parkway. **Free e-Books.** At [Gutenberg.org](http://Gutenberg.org) or the [University of Pennsylvania online books page](#), you won't pay a cent to legally download thousands of books whose copyrights have expired, including War and Peace, Moby Dick and Little Women. You can also search for free e-books at [Amazon.com](http://Amazon.com), [BarnesandNoble.com](http://BarnesandNoble.com) and [iTunes.com](http://iTunes.com).

For newer titles, check out your public library. Or join a free online lending community such as [ebookfling](http://ebookfling). You list your Kindle and Nook ebooks on the site (the publisher has to have chosen to enable the title for lending), then you swap ebooks with other members. Borrowers have 14 days to read the book.

**Free Audio Books.** If you love to read but don't have the time, download free audiobooks legally from [Librophile.com](http://Librophile.com) and [BooksShouldBeFree.com](http://BooksShouldBeFree.com). You can listen on your computer or MP3 player while you sit in traffic, fold laundry, exercise or simply relax. The sites offer up classic books whose copyrights have expired, including works from Jane Austen, Edgar Allen Poe, Ayn Rand and more. They also have children's titles, such as

The Three Little Pigs and The Secret Garden. To get newer audiobook titles for free, check out your public library.

**Free Music.** Get your groove on with free music streaming services, such as [Pandora.com](http://Pandora.com), [Grooveshark.com](http://Grooveshark.com) and [Spotify.com](http://Spotify.com). You can access them online, or install their handy apps to take the tunes on the go.

**Free Classes.** Many colleges and universities post course material and lectures on their Web sites, including [Johns Hopkins](http://Johns Hopkins), [University of Notre Dame](http://University of Notre Dame) and [Massachusetts Institute of Technology](http://Massachusetts Institute of Technology). [Saylor.org](http://Saylor.org) compiles open coursework from top-notch universities into more than 200 classes and awards certificates upon completion. You can also go to [Apple's iTunes U](http://Apple's iTunes U) to access more than 250,000 free lectures, videos and other materials from 600 universities, including the [Khan Academy](http://Khan Academy), [Oxford](http://Oxford), [Stanford](http://Stanford) and [Yale](http://Yale).

**Free Passport Photos.** You'll pay about \$15 at the post office to get your picture taken for your passport. Instead, take your photo with your own digital camera, then upload it to [ePassportPhoto.com](http://ePassportPhoto.com), which will help you size it properly before printing on your home printer.
