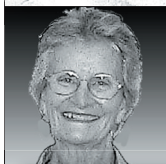

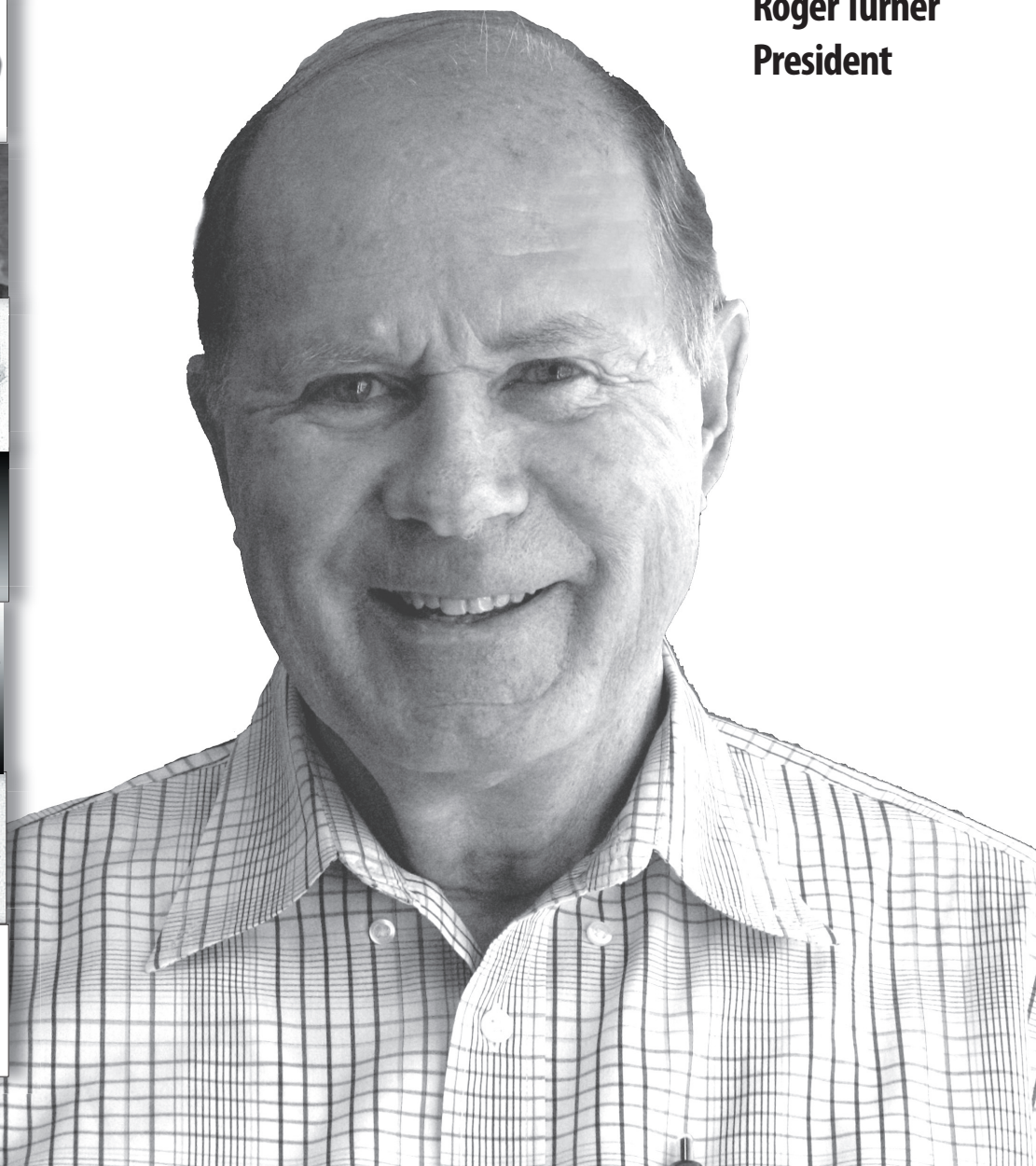

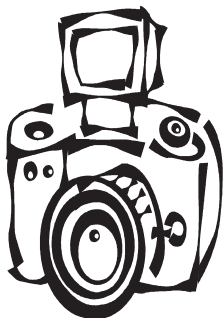

A History Lesson from the Files of the Computer Club and People Who Lived Through It

Many thanks to Sol Shankar for his content and Norm Salzberg for his lists.

Back in the dear, dead days beyond recall, computers in their infancy were a fascinating item as were the "geeks" who worked and tinkered with them. About 1980, the electronic shop started playing with computer parts. More and more computers showed up, so our resident shop members started to learn about computers. Most went to Saddleback College for classes, which were in their infancy also. Knowing some of these esteemed gentlemen, I

imagine they challenged each other to see who was the first to get the problem solved.

The early computers were based on the octal math system of 8 (Sol Shenker explained this to me). You had to have a technical and mathematical mind to understand the whole process. IBM was one of the first to start putting out instructions on how to build a computer. Each was different. The first machines had no keyboards, but had a series of lights with a series of toggle switches that you pressed in combination to get lights which translated into words. Eventually TV sets were hooked up to the keyboards so using the computers became easier. Are we spoiled or

what?

Memory storage changed over time. At first, memory was a tape with holes in it. Then it became a disk that looked like a 33 RPM record, about 8" in diameter. It was magnetic and the light pulses were recorded. The disks were clumsy and broke easily. Eventually the disks became smaller: a 5" and then to the 3½ " floppy that we know and loved. Now even that is obsolete and we are using CDs.

Some factoids: In 1980 a TR 80 computer was in use in the electronics lab in CH1. By June 81, this was upgraded from 4K to 8K and donated to GRF. Sounds real primitive, doesn't it? In 1982 a person with computer knowledge could get a job for \$34,000-\$50,000. Back then, if you had a computer, it had a name like Apple, Epson, Franklin, Heath, HP, Homebrew, Imsai, Kaypro, LNW, Max-80, Osborne, Sanyo, Synclair, TI99, TRS-80, Vic-20 and C64. Most of the personal computers of that time were made from kits as the price of ready-mades was prohibitive.

New Business:-Bert Goldstein reports there is a need for ProShow Gold lessons for all of the Workshop Supervisors. Norm is in agreement with that.

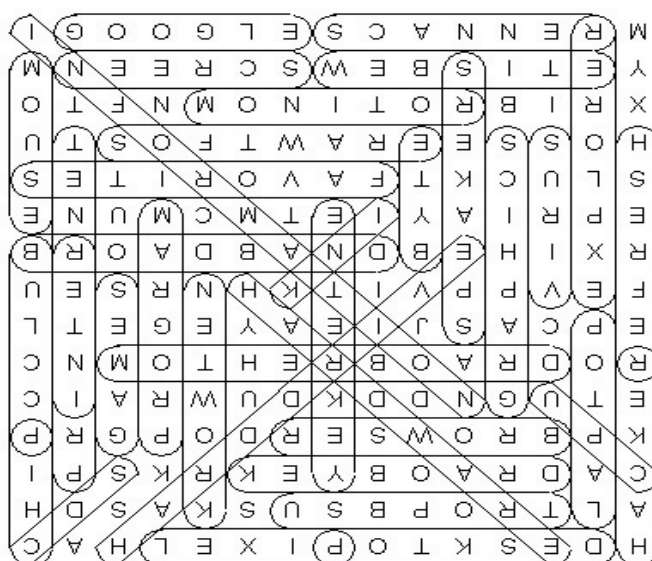
Office Max may offer a 10% discount to LWVPC Club members.

What's New in the PC Workshop?

The PC Club's Workshop maintains 32 state-of-the-art computers, three scanners and various programs for residents to use. Ten Dell PCs with Pentium IV CPUs were installed last November. In June, eight PCs with Celeron D CPU's, one PC with an AMD CPU, and one PC with an Intel Pentium IV CPU were installed. All operate at 3.0 GHz and have at least 512 MB RAM. A local vendor built the last 10 units.

The Workshop is a WiFi Hotspot. A wireless router was connected to

the local network for laptop owners to access the Internet. A high-end Epson scanner (donated by a resident) replaced an older scanner in the digital imaging area.

All computers have Office 2000 or 2003. Photoshop Elements 3.0 and ProShow Gold, a slide show creator program, (donated by Photodex) are available on the digital imaging computers. A test version of Windows Vista will be installed on one of the new PCs shortly.

A heavy-duty HP 2430 laser printer was installed in July to replace one of the older network printers. The laser printer is provided for visitors to print limited pages

(e-mail, documents, small portions of a web page) at no charge for their personal use. Please use Reproduction Services in the lobby of the Community Center for large print jobs.

Aside from donations, it's your PC Club dues that pay for new equipment and programs. It takes 70 volunteers to staff the eleven shifts. If you have three hours a week to spare, the Workshop will train you to become a Supervisor or Greeter.

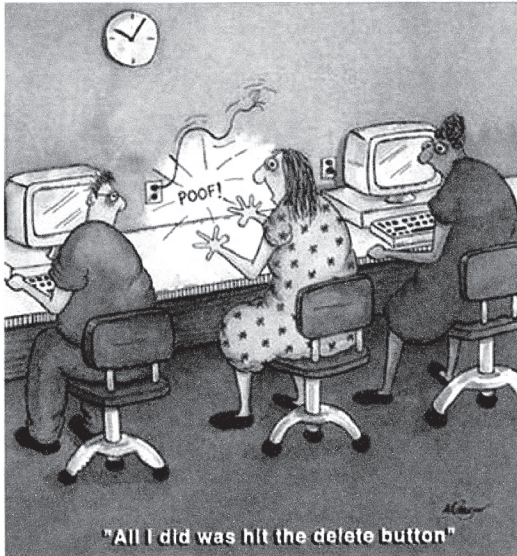
