The new mayor's goals for Laguna Woods

Shari Horne was elected mayor last month in a unanimous vote by the Laguna Woods City Council. Horne, who has served on City Council since 2014, also sits on the county's Senior Citizens Advisory Council and is a senior assembly member on the California Senior Legislature. The Globe caught up with her to find out about her priorities for 2017 and beyond.

Q: What goals do you want to achieve as mayor?

A: The mayor is just one of the team so you don't really have specific goals as mayor, as you do for the whole council. I would like to see our work plan move forward and all the things we're working on as a council to be accomplished, and I would like to see all the spaces filled. I know we're getting a new Aldi and (Dollar Tree), but I'd like to see all of our commercial areas filled up. There is something I am working on personally, and it's that golf cart crossing on Health Center Drive and Calle De La Plata, across (Paseo de Valencia).

Q: Any other specific goals?

A: I'd like to see our dog park renovated, to see the new carpeting put in there. I'd like to see that get done very quickly, because when it gets hot it burns the little paws of the dogs.

Q: How do you plan to expand senior advocacy?

A: I'm working right now with people from nonprofits and other elected officials on the Orange County Specific Plan on Aging. They have five specific areas, including transportation, elder abuse and social access. I'm sitting on a few of (the committees), and what they're trying to do is get an 18-month pilot program going to see if any of the ideas coming from these work groups can be expanded throughout the county

Q: How do you plan to apply your expe-

LAGUNA WOODS • Advances in technology and its growing necessity in everyday life bring the increasing vulnerability of users to cybercrimes. Despite Laguna Woods' low crime rates, many residents have expressed concerns about cybercrime, fraud and telephone scams plaguing the community.

"(Scammers) called several times and

I hung up on them," said Helen Coutant, member of the PC Club. "I got a call back each time, scolding me for not calling them and listed scary consequences for me. These people were scary in content and tone."

Coutant's story is not uncommon, with California having the highest number of cybercrimes in the United States, according to an FBI report. In 2015, the

United approves additional occupant fee

LAGUNA WOODS • A resolution to assess a \$90 monthly fee for each additional occupant over two was approved by United Mutual on Tuesday.

Currently, the Golden Rain Foundation charges a \$49 fee per manor per month when more than two people occupy a unit for "incremental wear and tear to community facilities and use of services."

The additional fee for United is intended to cover costs for items such as electricity, water, sewer, trash and maintenance. The fee will not be charged for live-in caregivers.

The board approved the resolution 9-2, with President Lenny Ross and Director Cash Achrekar abstaining. The fee will take effect April 1, after the board revisits the issue in February.

Cable service

In a unanimous vote, United approved an endorsement that will allow deactivation of cable services at a delinquent member's unit.

The policy will be revisited in February before it goes into effect.

Nonsmoking policy

In a unanimous vote, United Mutual approved a nonsmoking policy. The pol-

Season of peace can connect, empower

According to park rangers in the Northern California Pacific Coast forests, the redwoods and sequoias have an underground secret. These mammoth trees with shallow root systems in loose soil on hilly terrains are able to survive – and thrive – because their roots reach outward and wrap tightly around the roots of their

neighbors. This fascinating fact of nature is a good role model for how we can become more connected to each other without the necessity of a deep, lifelong time together.

January offers a clean slate, the start of a season not associated with winter, spring, summer or fall. Called the Season for Nonviolence, it occurs Jan. 30-April 4. Originally the season was meant to honor Mahatma Gandhi's 50th memorial anni-

versary and Martin Luther King's 30th anniversary at a United Nations function. Now it is an active, 64-day educational, media, and grass-roots campaign that demonstrates how nonviolence is a compelling way to heal, transform and empower our lives and communities. According to Barbara Fields in Unity Magazine's

latest issue, "through countless creative programs, events, study groups, exhibitions, and services, 900 cities across 167 countries have celebrated the Season since inception."

What does participation in the Season for Nonviolence look like? It can be as simple as choosing to share a smile. In a more organized manner, there is the option to participate with others from organizations and faith groups hosting activities relat-

ed to the season.

Examples of events are screenings of the movie "Gandhi," focus group meetings to discuss community programs promoting peace and nonviolence, and theme-related presentations. Hands-on projects such as creating peace gardens, peace poles and peace flags attract people of all ages and walks of life who participate alongside each other for a common goal.

Just as the roots of the redwoods and sequoias reach out to other trees, opportunities abound for us to strengthen our outreach to others in a greater spirit of peace. The Season for Nonviolence doesn't have to end April 4. Its mission can be a choice at any time.

rience from the Senior Citizen Advisory Council to your position as mayor?

A: To reach out to people. I want to have one day out of the week where I can be at City Hall and people can come and talk to me, either about issues they have or things that work particularly well in this city, or in other cities that they would like to see here.

Q: In your work with the California Senior Legislature, what will you be doing in Sacramento this month?

A: The last time we were there we got our top 10 state and federal proposals. So what we're going to be doing is talking to the Assembly and Senate members to see if they would pick up our proposals and push them through so they get chaptered into law. We've had over 260 proposals chaptered into law over the time that the Senior Legisla-

ture has been in existence. One of the last ones is the Death With Dignity law.

Q: As an environmental activist, do you have plans to improve efficiency in Laguna Woods?

A: I would like to see more multimodal trails, because it's good for people and it's good for the earth.

For clean air and water, I'd like us to look at the smoking rules again. I'm very happy the Third Mutual is now looking into making some of the buildings smoking restricted, or allowing some residents to do that, like they are in United.

Q: What do you want Laguna Woods to look like when you retire from your position as mayor?

A: I would like all of our sidewalks to be built into multimodal trails. I would like to see us fully connected to other cities with bike lanes that golf carts could take, and I would like to see our seniors trundling around on their golf carts all over the place and have access to everything.

state accounted for nearly 15 percent of the 288,012 cybercrime victims nationwide, the report stated, with \$195 million in statewide losses.

Fortunately for Laguna Woods, new police services chief Lt. Fred Thompson has an extensive background in cybercrime and fraud, having been part of the Orange County Sheriff's Department Cybercrimes Investigations Unit.

Cybercrime, fraud and scams are a growing danger, Thompson said. Criminals tend to prey on people who are more vulnerable and susceptible to digital crimes, such as older adults, he said.

Scams typically involve dishonest allegations, ranging from claims that a grandchild vacationing in Europe is in need of emergency money to demanding payment of a fine for missing jury duty, Thompson said. The easiest way a person can avoid becoming a victim to these scams is by simply hanging up the phone, he said, since most government agencies send information by mail only.

"Most of us here in the Village were not born in a generation where we used computers much, if at all," said Bob Sellards, president of the PC Club. "We have many people who come in (to the PC workshop) and we're all trying to catch up with our grandkids." Sellards and Coutant suspect that criminals could be using the Laguna Woods ZIP code to track down phone numbers of elderly people as targets.

"The likelihood of getting a senior who lives in this Village is very high," Sellards said. "If you make enough calls, it's just the law of averages; if you make 20 calls a day you just need one or two to bite."

In addition to fraud and telephone scams, Thompson said, he fears the "internet of things" will become another opportunity for crime. The internet of things includes any device that connects to the internet, such as mobile-operated security systems, garage doors and other smart devices. Since these devices are connected to a network, criminals can access them if they are able to hack into the network.

Avoid becoming a victim to cybercrime, fraud or scams by using common sense, Thompson said. Take precautionary steps such as using firewalls on computers and difficult passwords.

According to the Sheriff's Department, current scams include a text-phishing scheme claiming to be Social Security and asking for personal information, online employment scams that offer free checks, a tech-support scam claiming the caller is from Microsoft Tech, telephone requests for tax information, and a warrant for your arrest.

How to stay safe from telephone scams

Use common sense. If it's too good to be true, it probably is.

Do not give personal information to anyone, unless you recognize the voice or are certain it is the person or organization the caller claims to be from.

Keep in mind that government entities do not contact people via phone.

those who want to learn more about scams and cybercrime and how to avoid them. The PC Club teaches its members how to avoid becoming victims of cybercrime, fraud and telephone scams, Sellards said.

icy is similar to the city's ordinance, which prohibits smoking in all public areas.

If passed when revisited in February, the policy will prohibit smoking in all public and many common areas. Residents can smoke tobacco and marijuana in their units if the doors and windows are closed. If the policy is violated, the board has the authority to impose fines, suspend member privileges and/or use legal action.

Building classifications

United unanimously voted to modify the Monterey-style buildings classification from a one bedroom plus a den to a two-bedroom unit for manors with original construction only. Vehicle decal recommendations per number of bedrooms remain the same; two-bedroom units will receive up to three vehicle decals.

Resales

The average resale price of a co-op in December was \$238,215, up from \$225,157 in December 2015. Resales year to date numbered 518. Sales volume in December was \$8 million, down from \$9.4 million in December 2015.





While I walk my dog on-leash, he still loves to fetch so I recommend highly the Laguna Beach dog park. It's lovely, expansive, and grass. Yes, it's a bit farther and harder to park, but well worth it.

ing disc that's on the opponent's side of the court, most players shoot from the #1 disc position near the middle of the board. However, after you've attempted this takeout shot, if you notice your disc is drifting too far to the edge of the court & missing or nearly missing the opponent's scoring disc, shoot from the #4 disc position. This wider, more crosscourt shot can reduce drift on your opponent's side of the board & increase accuracy on takeout shots. This shot works well when shooting on 1 black head, 1 black foot, 2 black foot, 2 yellow foot, 5 vellow head & 5 black foot. So next time you've been assigned to play on these court spots, try shooting a crosscourt takeout shot from the #4 disc position.


